



## ONPE facilitates the review of over 77,000 ballots of the Second Presidential Election

As a token of the absolute transparency and impartiality in the organization and execution of the Second Presidential Election, the National Office of Electoral Processes of Peru (ONPE) publishes the digitized image of over 77,000 ballots used for official results processing at its website ([www.onpe.gob.pe](http://www.onpe.gob.pe)).

This way, it allows citizens, parties, media and domestic and foreign observers to be able reviewing the digital version of counting ballots created by polling supervisors, as proof of the verdict expressed by the electorate at the Peruvian presidential elections held on Sunday Jun 5th, 2016.

We can know how the installation, the voting and the counting of votes went on each one of the election official tables y reviewing the ballots. The access link to the ballots is: <https://resultadoselecciones2016.onpe.gob.pe/PRP2V2016/Actas-por-Ubigeo.html#posicion>

There are two ways to see the digital version of any ballot. They are finding them according to the geographic location or the number of election official table. For instance, in La Punta district, Callao, where the electronic voting , we can see the simplicity provided by the electronic voting to polling supervisors, as well as the speed of the electoral process through the digitized ballot.

As well as, while the voting concluded at 4:02 o'clock, the counting concluded at 4:11 o'clock, that is, eight minutes later.

By reviewing the ballot, we can also know the Peruvian Identity Card (ID), names and first names of polling supervisors, who must append only their signatures, as electronic voting system provides all their particulars.

Ballots digitalization also contributes to knowing the counting was fast on the election official table N°000169, Aramango district, Bagua province (Amazonas). It began at 4:10 o'clock and concluded at 4:40 o'clock. We can also know that out of 298 electors, 199 citizens attended to cast their vote.

### Voting overseas

This option also contributes to knowing how the installation, voting and counting were carried out on the election official tables installed overseas, where a total of 884,924 compatriots cast the vote.

For instance, the election official table N°072727 worked at Augusto Zubiri Rubio coliseum located in Arica city (Chile). The election official table was installed at 8:30 A.M. and 189 of 268 compatriots cast the vote. The counting lasted only 50 minutes, registering one blank vote, 13 invalid ballots and 0 challenged ballots.

Likewise, the election official table N°074313 was installed at the General Consulate of Peru located at Al Habtoor Business Tower, in the far Dubai (United Arab Emirates), an average of 18 hours away in commercial flight.

The voting began at 8:30 A.M. on that table and 38 of 94 compatriots attended to cast the vote. The counting concluded at 4:50 P.M.

### More information

As part of the transparency measures with respect to the course of the electoral process, the election observers of the two parties in competition have monitored the course of ballots processing, 24 hours a day from each one of 60 count centers settled throughout the country.
