Did you know that...

because we live in a democracy, we have the right to choose? Therefore, in the General Elections on April 11, 2021, we will elect the people who will hold the positions of:



■ President and Vice President. The president of the republic exercises the leadership of the Executive Branch and of the Armed Forces and the National Police of Peru. In addition, he or she directs the general policy of the State. Those who occupy the position of vice president replace the president of the republic in circumstances determined by the Constitution.

- Congressman. Its functions are:
- Representing citizens, i.e. Listening to their concerns and proposals..
- Legislate, which is to propose and approve, through debate, laws that benefit the country.
- •To oversee or exercise political control of the Government and the public administration in general.





Andean Parliamentarian. Its function is to represent us before the Andean Parliament. With its counterparts in Colombia, Chile, Ecuador, and Bolivia, it proposes measures on problems that affect the Andean Community in education, migration, security, environment, climate change, entrepreneurship, among others.


For the period 2021-2026, we will elect a president and two vice presidents, as well as one hundred and thirty congressmen and five regular representatives, and ten alternates for the Andean Parliament.

It will be the first time that Peruvian citizens living abroad will elect their representatives in the Congress of the Republic (two of the one hundred and thirty).

How to vote in each election?

Mark with an X (X) or a plus sign (+) only for one political organization each time. The mark must be within the box of the symbol or the photo; otherwise, the vote will be void.

- If you make another type of mark, your vote will also be void. In the section for president and vice presidents, you can mark the symbol or the photo.
- In the section for congressmen and Andean Parliament, you can mark a symbol and, next to it, write the number of one or two of the candidates of your choice.

If you don't mark a box, your vote will be considered to be blank.

+ It is better to bring my own pen (preferably blue ink).



→ I will use my mask properly, ensuring that it always covers my nose and mouth.



■ Upon entering the premises, I will allow my temperature* to be checked and I will use gel alcohol to disinfect my hands.




→ While in line, I will keep a meter and a half distance from the person in front of me.



→ Before entering my table, I will find my name in the list of voters and will memorize my order number.



→ While at the polling station, I will keep a meter and a half distance.



→ I will provide my ID card and my order number to facilitate faster voting.



Also, be prepared to be a polling station member member. If it is necessary to complete the voting table, those who will make it up will be chosen from the electorate who is in line.

*If you have a temperature greater than 37.5, you will be restricted from entering.

These are the **VOTING STEPS**

Find out where **YOUR POLLING PLACE** is.



We need your cooperation with the preferential treatment. ALWAYS KEEP PROPER DISTANCE, and, before you vote. CHECK YOUR ORDER NUMBER in



PRESENT your ID and give your order number so they can locate you quickly.

Enter the private voting area with your ballot and VOTE.

Then **PUT IT IN** the ballot box.

SIGN and put your fingerprint on the voter's

RECEIVE YOUR ID with the hologram



THOSE WHO TURN 18 YEARS OLD on or before April 11 must also vote. They will be able to use the yellow ID if they have not been able to change it to the blue ID. You can also vote with an expired ID.

If you are a transgender person and your gender identity does not match your ID data, it will not impede your ability to vote. Your right to vote is guaranteed.

Keep in mind:



It is very important to find out, in advance, where your polling location is. Remember, it will not always be at the same place where you voted last.



By resolution 054-2021-JN / ONPE, of March 2, 2021, consular offices were empowered to take advantage of the new hours on election day, from 08:00 to 16:00. Also, if there are any specific restrictions, they are empowered to establish a more restricted schedule.



Therefore, it is important to find out, in advance for each consulate, what time you can go to vote.
